TELL ME ABOUT YOU AND YOUR GOD, GODS, OR NOT G*D:

One of the blessings of Mathew P. Taylor, one of our members who served on the DRUUMM Steering Committee until his tragic passing last year, was their ministry with Covenant UU. Not all DRUUMM members share these experiences. Many have confessed how being UU and a Person of Color is marked by immediate calls to church leadership and anti-racism organizing. Some have noted how the main time they are asked to be in worship is when it relates explicitly to their perceived or real ethnic and cultural background. For example leading Dia de los Muertos, MLK Sunday, Divali, and so on. It is complicated.

FALL CAUCUS: OCT 1ST



Our Unitarian Universalist community is increasingly a multifaith space, emerging out of liberal christian traditions predominantly but not exclusively in Western contexts. In this dynamic and changing context, we each come from unique religious roots and lived experiences.

Our members have expressed a desire to deepen our grounding as Unitarian Universalists. We know each of us has a unique complexity, from our birth faith to our aspiring and living practice. We have shared interests in authentically living a lifelong UU journey, with some meaningfully sustaining a multireligious spiritual life, and/or seeking refuge and a new religious home from upbringings that we have left behind.





These are the roots from which we invite DRUUMM members and interested BIPOC friends to participate in our Fall Caucus on Religious & Spiritual Journeys. This is an opportunity to connect with Black, Indigenous, and People of Color in Unitarian Universalism and explore, listen, and integrate new understandings of our individual and collective spiritual and religious journeys. We will caucus on the question "Tell me about you and your god, gods, or not g*d" and in small groups organized as much as possible by the more particular religious identity you claim. Why are you UU? What is the culture and place of your personal faith journey? Our time together will include an opening in-gathering with a panel of Ministers of Color engaging in the caucus question followed by small groups of 3-5 people where you will self-select a facilitator, notetaker, and vibes/time observer. We will close with the purpose of notetakers sharing back and integrating our discussions as a whole. Join us for this sacred work that makes brave and safe space for the spirit and shapes our UU faith.



DIVERSE & REVOLUTIONARY UU MULTICULTURAL MINISTRIES

- Our end of year balance statement for DRUUMM is just over \$300,000, putting us in the strongest financial position in history. Part of this is due to increased giving from members and our Public Worship that had over 50 sponsoring congregations, and reduced spending during the pandemic. The Steering Committee will be meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, November 11-14, 2022. The visit will include time for strategic planning, a Community MeetUp on Saturday November 12th in-person with members in the area, and a vigil at the site of one of the Atlanta Spa Shootings that took the lives of mostly Asian American women in 2021.
